


- ### Erosion-related Considerations
- Community is situated where a large river spreads across a delta
  - Urban development along both banks has altered natural flooding and erosion processes along the river and delta
  - Armouring and joining islands (Terminal C) changes flow paths on the delta
  - Shoreline of Great Slave Lake has changed in some areas over time because of river and coastal processes
  - Permafrost not known to be a key contributor to riverbank instability
